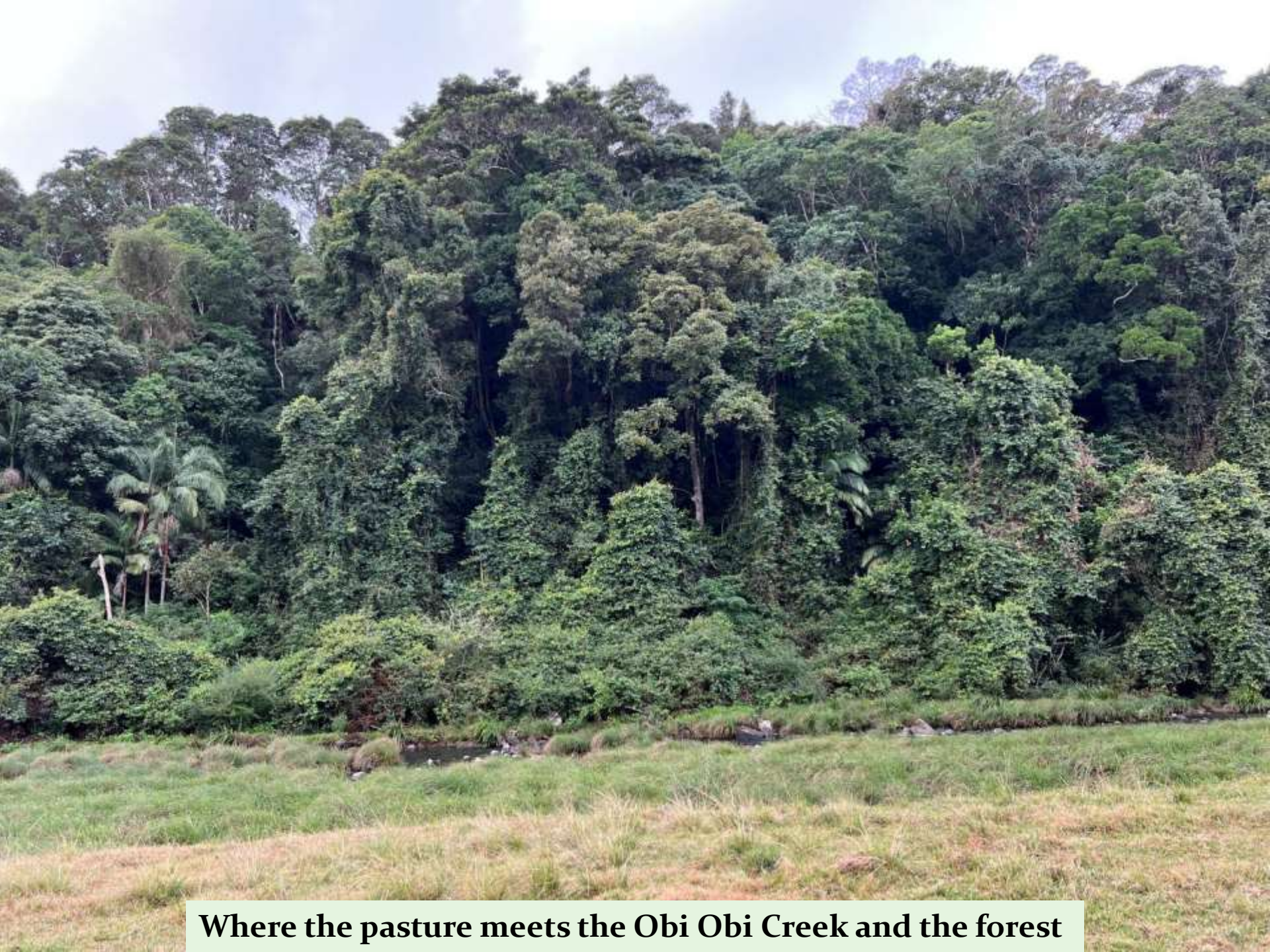
- A Sunday site visit to the Landholder's Farm Lake Baroon
